

# Future ACES activities, workshops and WG meetings

## International Science Board (ISB) meetings

ISB meetings will be held at least once per year. These will normally be held during major workshops and smaller WG meetings. During the ISB meeting of the 1<sup>st</sup> ACES workshop:

- A budget was developed that represents an equitable plan for pooled funding to be managed by the ACES Executive Office.
- A program of key activities until 2004 was agreed with core funding to be provided by the Executive Office.
- It was unanimously agreed that:
  - The By-laws should be finalised taking into consideration all input received to date, and in addition, new input to be received from SCEC now that it has taken the role of lead organisation in USA regarding ACES. Once final revisions have been made and mutually endorsed by the ISB Members, the By-laws could be ratified.
  - The draft Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) should be revised into an acceptable form by ISB representatives, and signed by an appropriate representative in each participant economy.
